With the graduation of Naluja School of Ministry, a new class can begin. The next place on my list of places the people have asked me to come is Kandazovu. When the dam was built on the Zambezi River, people had to move or drown in Lake Kariba. A group was moved by the government to a very remote place reserved for the Kafue National Park and game management. This movement of people formed the Village Kandazovu. I've driven through extremely difficult places over the years. Nothing compares to this. Classes scheduled for March could be the most challenging journey ever. Why go to such a difficult place and teach the most unlikely people? The words of Jesus in Matthew chapter 25 ring in my ears, "In as much as you have done it unto the least of these my brethren, you have done it unto me." God has called me to bring The University of the Holy Spirit to the hungry, thirsty, stranger, naked, sick, and in prison. For a Monday through Friday, about every other month, we have plenty of food to nourish our bodies, while our spirits are fed, overflowing, knowing God, clothed in righteousness, healed, and set free. The students will never be the same again. They will become the teachers, spreading the good news of Jesus Christ to

places I'll never know. I experienced fruit from these classes at Siampayma, where I was asked to come and preach. I had been there before, when the church was small and met in a grass roofed

shelter. Today they have built a large brick building, and it was FULL! The Spirit of God was evident from the opening song. I've never had people listen more intently. The church fed us after the service. While eating, I could hear the sound of prayers coming from inside the building. The sick were healed and the demon possessed were set free while we were outside eating. Seeing (hearing) the Kingdom of God manifesting through the hands of local people is like a bright star of commendation for our life in Africa. I realize our work could never impress God. I also know

faith pleases God (Heb 11:6), and faith works by love (Gal 5:6). The great healings and miracles happen when we go out in faith, motivated only by our love of Christ. This is the time I'm flooded with joy unspeakable and full of glory, peace that passes all understanding, and God does exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think. Some of you have been with us on this journey from the



beginning, while others "got in the yoke" with us more recently. Our reward, or blessing, is yours. Some may feel their experience has been more like suffering than reward. Hold on to God and He will turn your suffering into something good. Like Jesus, we learn obedience through suffering (Heb 5:8). Why do I need obedience? "Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness? (Rom 6:16)" Obedience leads us to life as our Creator intended, the good life. Your partnership with this ministry demonstrates your obedience, which is "unto righteousness." I believe America will be shaken over the next couple of years. Your obedience unto righteousness will keep you through the storm and leave you on higher ground. increased their numbers. We have been able to help 165 student's grade 1-12. We even started our first Church orphan program here in Kalomo. Thanks Global Orphan Relief for allowing me to bring such Hope and Joy to these orphan children. It's a lot of time and effort put into running around and checking in on the different schools and children. We also get them their uniforms. It needs to be done in about three week's time for the beginning of the school year. Their last two terms of school are much easier to handle. All our children are growing up; I thank the Lord for their good health. I thank you all for your love and prayers.
