We were blessed with a team of 10 from North Carolina. People have asked me over the years if these short term trips are worth it. Ask any one of the ten. I'm sure they will "fill your ears" with story after story, and a great big YES, YES, YES! And no, it would not be because they were on an exotic holiday. Accommodations were rooms with no heat or air conditioning, concrete floors, roughly made bunk beds, and toilets outside with showers of cold water only. Transportation was in my old Land Rover and other 4x4s. It is rainy season, making the ride much more exciting. They endured my "combat driving to "worlds unknown" (we got off track and needed local help almost every time). They ministered to the orphans, at a couple of packed to overflowing churches, a medical clinic, and a school, all in very rural areas. The vast majority of people responded to the call of God for salvation. Some received God's healing touch and deliverance.

I'm writing this from my tent on top of the Land Rover, joyfully remembering the memories made with this team. I won't be able to send it on-line until I get home. I'm teaching in Nkandanzovu, about as remote as it gets. I arrived here Monday with mud all over me. The path

takes me to a steep river crossing. The mud looked thick, so I walked it first. I sunk in the mud almost to my knees. After struggling, I managed to pull my feet out of the mud, but my shoes were buried. By the time I got my shoes up, I was covered with mud. After getting the vehicle turned around, I found someone to show me another path where I could cross the river. Many smiling faces



greeted me when I arrived for classes. The people here are growing spiritually by leaps and bounds. After class I really dirtied the water in the wash pan behind a grass fence, ate and slept like a baby.

We continue to thank the Lord for the rains and what will surely be a good harvest this year. The Victoria Falls were at a high level when I went with the team. Hopefully, the water levels will

reach high enough to stop the need for blackouts. We are blessed with NO corona virus here, but we don't know how much the virus will affect our planned time in the States this April and May.
